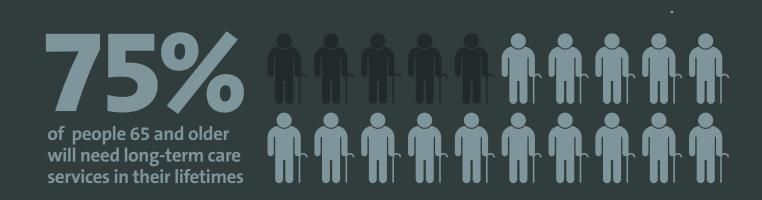

Many clients don't see the necessity for long-term care in their financial future. But that doesn't mean it won't be needed. Who needs to convey that to them?

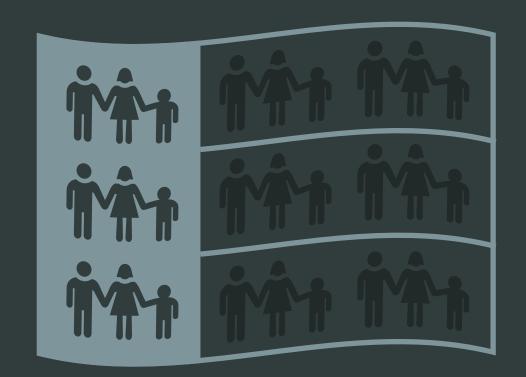
